ORDINANCE NO. 06-2023 BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A FINANCIAL AGREEMENT WITH HAVEN AT SEA BRIGHT URBAN RENEWAL, LLC

WHEREAS, pursuant to the <u>Local Redevelopment and Housing Law</u>, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "**LRHL**"), Block 13, Lots 13, 14, 15, 17, 18, 20, 21 and 22; Block 14, Lots 12 and 14; and Block 15, Lots 5 (formerly Lots 5, 6, and 7), 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 as identified on the tax maps of the Borough (as further defined in Section 1.2 herein, and as more specifically described in Exhibit 2 to the Application (the "**Project Site**") have been designated by the Mayor and Council as an "area in need of redevelopment" ("**Redevelopment Area**"); and

WHEREAS, on October 9, 2020, by Ordinance No. 10-2020, the Mayor and Borough Council approved a redevelopment plan for the revitalization and redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area entitled Sea Bright River Properties Redevelopment Plan, as amended by Ordinance No. 13-2022, adopted December 20, 2022 (and as same may be further amended from time to time, the "**Redevelopment Plan**"), a copy of which is on file with the Borough Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Borough, via Council Resolution 193-2022, adopted December 20, 2022, approved a redevelopment agreement with Denholtz Acquisition, LLC ("Denholtz"), setting forth the terms for Denholtz' residential development of a project (the "**Project**") in the Redevelopment Area, pursuant to the Redevelopment Plan (the "**Redevelopment Agreement**"); and

WHEREAS, Denholtz formed a special purpose entity, Haven at Sea Bright Urban Renewal, LLC (the "**Entity**"), to undertake the redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area, pursuant to the Redevelopment Plan and the Redevelopment Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Entity filed the application attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "**Application**") seeking a long term tax exemption pursuant to the <u>Long Term Tax Exemption Law</u>, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:20-1 <u>et seq</u>. (the "**LTTE Law**") and approval of a financial agreement for payment in lieu of taxes (the "**Financial Agreement**"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council, on the Mayor's recommendation, wishes to approve the Application and has determined that it is appropriate to enter into the Financial Agreement for the Project for a term of fifteen (15) years and to accept annual service charges from the Entity in lieu of real property taxes associated with the Project Site; and

WHEREAS, the parties have negotiated the Financial Agreement, and the Mayor and Council have determined that it is appropriate to approve the execution of the Financial Agreement between it and the Entity; and

WHEREAS, the Borough makes the following findings in accordance with Section 11 of the LTTE Law with respect to the Project (as hereinafter defined):

- 1. Relative Benefits of the Project: In accordance with LTTE, specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:20-11(a), the Borough hereby finds and determines that this Agreement is a direct benefit to the health, safety, welfare and financial well-being of the Borough and its citizens. The Project will accelerate the redevelopment successful marketing and sales of the Project. Further, the Project will generate jobs, increase tax ratables and provide public improvements. When compared to the costs, if any, associated with the tax exemption, the Borough finds that the benefits outweigh the costs, recognizing that the Borough will retain ninety-five percent (95%) of the amount of the PILOT.
- 2. Assessment of the Importance of the Tax Exemption: In accordance with the LTTE Law, specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:20-11(a), the Borough hereby finds and determines that this Agreement is a critical incentive for the Entity to develop the Project. The tax exemption will facilitate the successful development of the Project by making the units more attractive to purchasers; thus, resulting in the development of the Project in an area that contains vacant and underutilized parcels for which the Borough has previously been seeking redevelopers. As a result, the decisions of the potential purchasers will be positively influenced by the tax exemption.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The findings set forth above are hereby adopted and made part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Pursuant to the authority granted to the Borough under the LTTE Law, this Ordinance approves the Application and authorizes the execution of the Financial Agreement with Haven at Sea Bright Urban Renewal, LLC for a 15-year tax exemption with respect to the construction of a residential Project in the Redevelopment Area, pursuant to the Redevelopment Plan and Redevelopment Agreement.

Section 3. The Mayor is authorized to execute the Financial Agreement in substantially the form attached to the Application.

I HEREBY CERTIFY this to be a true and correct Ordinance of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, introduced on May 2, 2023 and will be further considered after a Public Hearing at the regular meeting of the Borough Council held on May 16, 2023 at 7:00 pm at 1097 Ocean Avenue, 3rd floor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Borough of Sea Bright, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey, authorizes for various capital acquisitions and improvements, including the acquisition of an automated patient stretcher system for the First Aid Squad, refurbishment of a fire engine for the Fire Department and to construct curbing in the Peninsula Parking Lot for the Borough of Sea Bright, to be funded from the sources specified in Section 2 of the Ordinance.

Section 2. The amount of \$180,000 is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in Section 1 of the Ordinance and which amount was funded from the Borough's General Capital Fund Balance (surplus) in the amount of \$180,000.

Section 3. In connection with the purpose and the amount authorized in Sections 1 and 2 hereof, the Borough determines the purpose described in Section 1 hereof is not a Current Expense and is an improvement which the Borough of Sea Bright may lawfully make as a general improvement.

<u>Section 4</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor Kelly commented that the Fireman's Fair was successful and everyone did a great job. There will be a public meeting on Thursday at 7:00pm with Highlands and Atlantic Highlands regarding regionalization. Hopefully all three towns will pass a resolution agreeing on the funding formula. Parking passes are available at the Police Department and paid parking is underway – Chief Friedman said there were a few kinks but everything is looking good - we are allowing the business parking passes in the municipal lot as the Church Street lot is not open yet. Mayor Kelly reported that the Memorial Day ceremony is set for May 29th and we are looking forward to a busy and safe summer in Sea Bright.

Councilman Lamia reported that he dropped off the 23 planters from along Ocean Avenue and will let DPW know when they will be ready to be picked up. Public Works dispersed the stones and striped the two gravel lots and we are ready to go.

Councilwoman Gorman thanked everyone who came out to volunteer for the Fireman's Fair and said they are still doing inventory on the game booths and should have numbers soon.

Assistant Fire Chief Rivera reported that he will have a formal report on the Fair proceeds for the next workshop meeting and said the FD appreciates the Governing Body allowing them to hold the Fair and thanked everyone who came out to help.

Councilman Bieber reminded everyone that the parking violations are higher this year and he has been working with the Beach Team and the Police Department on smoking and dog enforcement on the beaches.

REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE

Brad O'Connor, resident, asked for an update on the bulkhead repair ordinance. Councilman Bieber explained that the Council and professionals have been working on a strategy to effectively move forward. They are looking for an appropriate technical solution, funding sources and are trying to coordinate a cohesive approach to battling our flooding issues. Councilman Bieber asked Mr. O'Connor to contact him directly for more information. Mr. O'Connor expressed his frustration as he is directly affected by a neighbor's bulkhead and doesn't feel we should give anyone a pass.
