MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilman Bieber stated that he would like to reserve some time at the workshop meeting to review a number of pending ordinances and reported we will be finalizing the contract for the purchase of the train station pavilion for the Shrewsbury Riverfront Park this week. He also explained that during the recent heavy rain and flooding events he walked the town to get a close look at the conditions and was pleased that the check valves were working correctly and is confident that the upcoming bulkhead improvement project will be very beneficial for the town – along with the new pump station as part of the Haven project.

Councilman Keeler reported that the roadway around the bus stop was badly flooded making it difficult to get on the bus. He also said EMS would like to invite the Governing Body to attend a demonstration of the new Lucas chest compressor on either Thursday or Friday.

Councilman Lamia reported he took an inventory of wires throughout the town and found there are 47 wires that should no longer be in commission - he took pictures and recorded the locations and would like to discuss a strategy on how to remove them at the workshop meeting along with ideas to mitigate flooding in specific areas.

Councilman Catalano stated that he, and Councilmen Bieber and Lamia and Administrator Verruni met with the DEP to discuss our needs for sand replenishment – unfortunately, they do not have funding to include Sea Bright anytime soon. Monmouth Beach is getting sand which could potentially benefit our beaches.

Councilwoman Gorman reported that we are ten days out from the Community Center opening and they are working on getting the Edmunds platform up and running to provide a kind of "parks and recreation" page to provide information on recreation center activities and availability of the center. The DPW is working on some enhancements to the rec center and Councilwoman Gorman said she is working to line up volunteers to monitor and supervise the kids during "open" time.

Mayor Kelly reported that Highlands and Atlantic Highlands had a successful referendum election to move forward with regionalization. We will be staying on course and keep moving forward to hopefully get a second referendum vote in 2024. Our Counsel for educational matters, Vito Gagliardi, will be joining the upcoming executive session during the workshop meeting to discuss Sea Bright's plan in further detail.
