**Mayor Kelly** called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and requested those present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance

**Mayor Kelly** read the following Compliance Statement:

#### **REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE** (limited to 3 minutes)

The Public Comment portion of this meeting allows members of the audience to bring their concerns or comments to the Mayor and Council's attention. Pursuant to Borough Ordinance 3-2011, a member of the public who wishes to speak shall give his/her name and address for the record and may have up to three minutes to state his/her comments to the Mayor and Council as a Body. If additional time or information is requested, an appointment can be made with the Administrator's office during regular business hours.

Kevin Birdsall, resident, expressed his concerns regarding the recent tax assessments. He stated homes outside the downtown had an increase between 16% -18% and homes in the downtown had an increase of 20% - 28% across the board and noticed that homes valued over \$1 million were increased 16% and under \$1 million it was 20-28%. Beach clubs only went up 2% and downtown businesses went up about 4.5%. Residential properties that are owned by beach clubs went up less than 2%. It does not make any sense and is seeking clarification. He also questioned the \$25 increase on pre-season beach badges – he said if he was a conspiracy theorist, he would fear the Council is trying to push out the middle class from town.

Mike Cohen, resident, stated his property assessment was raised from \$1.4 to \$2.4 million – his property taxes are going to double and is going to be forced to sell his home at 66 years old with a fixed income. Tax Assessor, Tim Anfuso, recommended he submit an appeal. Mr. Cohen is frustrated with the response and process. Mr. Cohen gave examples of neighbor's assessments that are significantly below his but have larger homes with water views.

Jerry Kean, resident, questioned when the budget will be available to view and what large projects are planned that is driving the increase in taxes. Administrator Verruni explained that the 2024 budget will be developed in the first quarter of the year. CFO Michael Bascom stated that the budget document will be available to view at introduction which will most likely be the end of February or beginning of March.

Kevin Birdsall, resident, questioned when we can expect the tax rate to be finalized which will determine what we pay. Mr. Bascom stated that the budget is capped by a 2% increase in the tax levy, and we should know the municipal budget's tax rate by late April but we won't know the final overall tax rate which includes county and school tax until mid-June.

Barbara Nadler, resident, stated that about two years ago it was determined that there is a problem with the storm drain adjacent to her home in north beach. Public Works visited the site and explained that the State is responsible as it is on Ocean Avenue and the Borough could not be of any assistance. Ms. Nadler stated she is extremely frustrated that she has called numerous people at the state and town and is not receiving any help or a return phone call. The water continues to come up closer and closer to her home and, in the summer, because it doesn't drain, is causing an insect problem. Mr. Verruni apologized that she has not received a phone call but he explained he has been trying to work with Senator O'Scanlon on this matter but does not have a solution at this time. Mayor Kelly assured her that she will be kept in the loop moving forward.

Murphy Anderson, resident, stated his frustration with the Borough's construction of his home – it is falling apart and that they have done nothing to resolve it and the assessment increases.

**WHEREAS**, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright (the "Borough") has determined that it is in the best interests of the Borough and its residents to provide regulations regarding the requirements and use of fire pits within the Borough and to provide penalties for violations thereof.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Bright, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION ONE**. Chapter 107 is hereby added to the Code of the Borough of Sea Bright to read, in full, as follows:

#### **Chapter 107. Fire Pits**

#### § 107-1. Fire Pits Authorized; Definitions.

- A. Fire pits or other similar devices are authorized within the Borough of Sea Bright subject to the restrictions set forth in this chapter. For the purpose of this chapter, a fire pit shall be considered as any outdoor fireplace unit built after obtaining permits and approvals pursuant to the Uniform Construction Code; or
- B. Any equipment designed and used for outdoor fires and operated pursuant to manufacturer's instructions.
  - C. For the purpose of this chapter, gas or propane operated fire pits are excluded.

## § 107-2. Limitation of Size.

All such fireplaces or fire pits as set forth above shall be no larger than three feet in diameter and two feet in height and are required to have an approved screen or spark arrestor.

#### § 107-3. Location Requirements.

- A. Such fireplaces or fire pits may only be used at residential properties containing two or fewer units and are prohibited from being used at any commercial establishment or for any commercial use or at any multifamily dwelling in excess of two units.
- B. All such devices shall be kept at ground level and must be placed upon a noncombustible surface such as brick or cement. No such devices shall be permitted on any type of elevated landing, surface, deck, stairway, roof or other elevated platform or portion of a structure.
- C. Said devices are prohibited from being used within 15 feet of any structure, including but not limited to homes, garages, sheds, showers or other such structures.
- D. Such devices are prohibited from being used within five feet of any other combustible surface, including but not limited to, bushes, fences, pools, plants, shrubs, houses used for feeding of sheltering animals or other combustible surfaces.
- E. Said devices are prohibited from being used underneath any cave, overhang, roof, wires, tree limbs, vegetation, gutter, downspouts or decks.
  - F. Fireplaces and fire pits are not permitted in the front yard.

#### § 107-4. Unattended Fire Pits Prohibited.

Any outdoor fireplace or fire pit must be constantly attended while in use and shall not be left unattended while any burning, smoldering or heat generation is taking place.

#### § 107-5. Hours.

No fireplace or fire pit shall be used in the Borough of Sea Bright other than during the hours between 9:00 a.m. and midnight.

#### § 107-6. Certain Burning Prohibited.

No trash or other waste such as garbage, leaves, construction debris, rubbish, plastic materials, leather, furniture or petroleum-based materials may be used to fuel any fire in an outdoor fireplace or fire pit within the Borough of Sea Bright. Only dry, seasoned firewood or prepackaged "Duraflame" type logs may be used as fuel for any fire in a fireplace or fire pit within the Borough of Sea Bright. The same shall be lighted by the minimal amount of newspaper or wood kindling necessary. Under no condition shall a flammable or combustible liquid such as lighter fluid, kerosene, gasoline or other combustible liquid be used to start, fuel or otherwise enhance any fire in a fireplace or fire pit in the Borough of Sea Bright.

#### § 107-7. Extinguishment Required.

No person shall leave the contents of a fire pit burning or smoldering unattended and/or after use and proper extinguishment of the same is required. For the purpose of this chapter, proper extinguishment of the contents of a fire pit may be obtained by using a fire extinguisher with a minimum of a 4A rating or a garden hose with suitable water supply. The fire shall be properly and thoroughly extinguished and ashes are to be properly disposed no sooner than 48 hours after burning. Ashes may be stored in a metal can with a tightly fitted lid which is located at least five feet away from any building or other combustible surface or material.

#### § 107-8. Enforcement.

The Sea Bright Police Department and the Code Enforcement Officer may enforce this chapter. Anyone authorized to enforce this chapter shall have the authority to immediately cause any person using a fire pit or fireplace within the Borough of Sea Bright to extinguish the same and order that the same not be used for an appropriate duration of time if said enforcement official believes that the continued use of a fire pit or fireplace may cause any of the following conditions:

- A. An increased risk of fire hazard due to wind or other atmospheric conditions.
- B. The use of any fireplace or fire pit in violation of this chapter.

## § 107-9. Precedence of Uniform Fire Code.

This chapter shall not apply to any burning that requires a permit to be obtained pursuant to the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code. To the extent this chapter is in conflict with the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code or the Uniform Construction Code, said Code shall take precedence.

#### § 107-10. Violations and Penalties.

- A. The following penalties shall be applicable for any violations of this chapter:
- (1) For a first offense: a violator shall be informed of the violation and ordered to properly extinguish the fire contained in the fireplace or fire pit. The violator shall be given a verbal warning and shall be subject to increased penalties for subsequent violations.
- (2) For second offense: for any offense which occurs within a twenty-four month period of the first offense, a violator shall be subject to a fine of no less than \$50 and no more than \$500.
- (3) For third or subsequent offense: for any offense which occurs within 24 months of a second offense, said violator shall be subject to a fine of no less than \$50 and no more \$1,250.
- B. A violation will be considered a subsequent offense if a previous offense has occurred at the same property address within 24 months of a previous offense even if a citation was issued to another individual at said address.

**SECTION TWO**. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to die section, paragraph, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

**SECTION THREE**. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to die extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION FOUR**. This ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication as provided by law.

Mayor Kelly stated that the school regionalization appeals entered from Oceanport and Shore Regional have been dismissed at the Superior Court. Frank Lawrence, Administrative Assistant for Special Projects, has finally received approval from FEMA for volunteer reimbursements of about \$456,000 from Superstorm Sandy. Councilman Bieber stated that he and Councilman Lamia have completed the first phase of the train station pavilion at the Shrewsbury Riverfront Park and hopes that it is completed by the summer. They will be searching for some train décor to make it look as original as possible. Councilman Bieber reported that Q4 of Planning Board was pretty quiet and a few meetings were actually cancelled as there is not much going on – most of the town is developed at this point. The personnel committee is diligently working on succession plans specifically for our Borough Administrator who will be leaving in the first half of the year. He thanked Mr. Verruni for his incredible service to the town.

Councilman Keeler reported that the First Aid is in possession of the new stretcher and chest compressor. They would like to do a demo after the Re-Org meeting when there is a lot of members of the public around.

Councilman Lamia reported he met with Senator O'Scanlon last night to ask for assistance with the NJDOT to get check valves installed on Ocean Avenue – we need to get to the bottom of this.

Councilman Catalano reported progress.

Councilwoman Gorman reminded everyone that we have our indoor farmers markets in the rec center on Wednesdays from 1:00pm-6:00pm and hopes that everyone will spread the word. The Historical Society will also be open on Wednesdays.
